Take a walk in the park day

On the 30th March 2017 it is take a walk in the park day. And that is exactly what the children at City Day Nursery are going to do. The children will be taking a little adventure to a local park on Thursday! Keep an eye out on our Facebook page to find out what they did on the day.

This is a chance for the children to connect with the natural world; first hand experiences of life and growth; endless opportunities for creativity and imagination and improved fitness and physical development. The countless benefits of outdoor play have a real positive impact on children's lives.

Some of the benefits from outdoor play...

There are clear health benefits associated with outdoor learning. Children need daily exercise, vigorous enough to get them out of breath with their hearts and lungs working hard. NHS guidelines say that children under 5 need three hours exercise a day and that it should be with a mixture of bone strengthening, muscle building and cardiovascular.

Exercise also improves children's emotional health, allowing for relaxation and calmness and a heightened sense of well being (Armstrong 1996). Exercise is clearly an essential component of children's physical and emotional development.



News From the Under 2's

This week the children in the under 2's section have been learning to mark make!

As adults, writing comes easily and without much thought, for children however, writing is a whole new skill requiring time, practice and encouragement. The skill of writing all starts with mark making.

It is easy to dismiss the different lines and circles children create on paper as mere 'scribbles', but actually, children are mark making, the first step towards writing... As well as enabling a child to learn to write, making marks can benefit a child physically, and also help to develop their imagination and creative skills.

Mark making opens the door for children to express themselves in a completely new way, offering them the opportunity to express their feelings and thoughts without relying solely

Jake couldn't believe how many books he could see and tried to count them. Lily was very excited to go back to nursery and show her friends all the books they had found.




Parent Notice
