Sensory Bags!



To make these sensory bags you just need zip lock bags, and tape. What you put inside can be from a wide variety of items including, Shaving gel, hair gel, slime, water etc Add some glitter, alphabet shapes, number shapes or sequins. Tape up each side with funky patterned sticky tape or any type of tape and let your child explore these cool bags!

Recipe

Chicken Pie with a carrot thatched top PREP: 40 MINS COOK: 50 MINS

- 1 large carrot
- 1 large potato
- 2 tbsp butter
- 1 slice cooked ham
- 3 chicken breast fillets
- 3 tbsp frozen peas
- 4 tbsp double cream

 Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan, then boil the carrot and potato whole for 5 minutes, then put them in a bowl of cold water to cool down. When cold, peel them carefully.
 Grate the carrot and potato (cut them into chunks first if you are using

- a rotary grater).3. Put the grated carrot and potato in a large bowl, add the melted butter and mix it all together.
- 4. Cut the ham into small pieces using scissors or a small knife, then cut the chicken into pieces.
- 5. Put the chicken and ham in a pie dish with the peas and cream and give everything a stir.
- 6. Spoon the carrot thatch onto the pie and ask your grown-up helper to put the pie in the oven for 50 minutes or until the chicken and top-
