COVID-19

We would again like to thank you for your continued support through the ongoing pandemic, Guidelines and procedures are changing regularly and we appreciate all of your patience with all the procedures that we continually update and put into place. We are continuing to follow the government guidelines closely and will keep you all updated with any changes that may need to be made through the Famly App. We are still continuing to do temperature checks daily on children and staff who enter the premises. The children have adapted to this procedure and have been wonderful in helping the smooth running of the nursery. We would like to remind you that if any temperature exceeds 37.8 then the persons will not be able to enter the building that day. Also if your child has a temperature they would not be allowed into the setting for 48 hours. We still have a fogging machine in all of our schoolhouse sites which is used weekly to ensure extra measures are taken to eliminate any potential risks.

If you or your child is showing any symptoms of COVID-19, we kindly ask that you do not bring your child to nursery and follow governments isolation guidelines.

These symptoms are:

- A new continuous cough
- A loss of taste or smell
- A high temperature

Easter biscuits



Preparation time **less than 30 mins**

Ingredients

For the dough

200g/7oz softened butter, plus extra for greasing 150g/5½oz caster sugar 2 large free-range egg yolks 400g/14oz plain flour, plus extra for dusting 1 level tsp ground mixed spice

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
