Children in need

This children in need we have had a fantastic week raising money. We have done some tasty cooking activities, a cake sale around the hospital and a dress up day. We always love to raise money for this wonderful cause and we will soon be counting up the coins to reveal our total.

Try it at home

You will need: Ready to roll shortcrust pastry, circle cookie cutter and smaller circle or star cookie cutter, icing sugar, a jar of mincemeat, 1 egg, cupcake baking tray.

Flour the work surface.

Roll out the pastry to a suitable thickness.

Use a circle cookie cutter a little bit larger than the size of the holes in your cake baking tray. Use these to cut the circle bases and put one into each hole in the tin.

Put a tablespoon of mincemeat mix into each base.

Use a star shaped cookie cutter to cut the tops of the mince pies and lay one on top of each filled pie.

Whisk the cracked egg with a fork and use a egg wash brush to brush gently over each mince pie.

Cook in the middle of a pre heated oven at 180 Fan.

Once cooled, sprinkle icing sugar over the top of each one to display.
