A very warm welcome back to all of our nursery children and families! It has been fantastic seeing you all return and welcoming you back to nursery. You have all grown so much during the time that you have been away, and it has been heart warming seeing the new skills you have learnt along the way.

Naturally, we have had to say farewell to some families and children, we hope that all of your new adventures, big or small are fantastic!

Under 2's

Our under 2's have been very busy with a range of different activities within their "bubble" groups. The children are particularly being enjoying sensory activities which have been set up throughout the day in the sections.

The most popular sensory activities have included finger painting and playing with bubbles. The children loved the bubbles activity so much, it has even been repeated for them to enjoy again!

The section has been spending time in the outdoor area and would like to ask for your suggestions regarding what you feel would further enhance the area.

Toddlers

The children in toddlers have been spending time creating different items of arts and crafts, these have included making jelly fish and fish puppets!

We have been spending a great deal of time outdoors and have made the most of all opportunities, we have even had our breakfast set up outside for the children to enjoy!

We have also enjoyed reading stories and then taking the opportunity to re-enact them outside, particularly We're Going on a Bear Hunt.

Toddlers have also enjoyed music and movement time busy feet and have also been taking time for calming toddler yoga.

Pre-school

The children have been reading various books, making resources and discussing a range of emotions. In addition, children enjoy a circle time as part of their daily routine in which we have been discussing feelings and emotions.

Natural items make great mark making resources. You could even glue on some leaves once your paint has dried!


Creating your own observations on Family

family


As childcare practitioners we love nothing more than seeing children developing new skills and enjoying new activities. We capture all of the moments we can, however we appreciate that some things simply just happen more naturally at home. We would like to encourage all parents to get involved in completing observations on Family by following these easy steps:

1. To create an observation of a child, you will need to go into their profile and click on 'Journey' and then 'New Observation' below.

Journey



2. A text box will appear and you will be able to add **text**, **photos** and **videos**. See the below screenshot for an example. Use the 'Upload' button to add photos and videos.



3. When you are finished making the post, you will send it for review. Rather than going straight onto the feed, nursery staff with the permission to do so, will review this post before sending.

If you get interrupted, the draft will save and you will find it by clicking the (left) icon top right hand corner.

Nursery staff will see the observation in the Child Development app and they can add EYO links, add Next Steps, request changes, take ownership or approve and send. When the nursery requests changes, you, as parent, will receive a notification.

We would like to ask parent to please ensure that they are taking items home that belong to their children only. Please could you also ensure that all items are clearly labelled with children's names.



You will need:

- Egg carton
- Markers or paint
- Counters

Instructions:

1. The first thing you need to do is cut the top off of the egg carton, as well as the flap that keep it closed.
2. Then you need to cut the ends off of the top so that they will fit on either side of the bottom.
3. Once you have an extra "bucket" on either end of the egg carton, tape them securely and you're ready to decorate!
4. Once the game board is secure and colored, you're ready to play! To set up the game, place 4 counters in each of the 12 cups (the main egg carton piece).
