We will also be spending more time in our new garden taking part in physical activities and small group play sessions "bringing the indoors



Ali's Nursery Summer special

Scrumptious strawberry summer mousse for you to enjoy!

<u>Ingredients</u>

- 12.5 ounces of strawberries
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1 cup of whipping cream
- Extra strawberries for topping

Instructions

- Clean and slice the strawberries. In a blender or food processor add the slices strawberries and the sugar and pure. Remove 1/2 cup of puree and set aside.
- In a cold bowl add the cream and beat until stiff peaks form. Then fold in the remaining puree 9not the 1/2 cup) gently.
- Divide the 1/2 cup of puree between the 4 small/medium bowls and top with the strawberry mousse. Refrigerate for approximately 1 hour or even overnight if desired. Top with fresh strawberries and serve.
