## Our Children's Themes and Activities....

#### <u> Under 2's</u>

We thought this newsletter would be a great way to let you know about what we have been learning about with our Babies. We would also like to welcome all our new families that have recently joined us. Amy and her team have enjoyed planning exciting Autumn activities where our under 2's have particularly enjoyed 'autumn animals in our tuff spot tray'. The children were encouraged to explore their senses as they touched different materials 'prickly hedgehog, bushy squirrel and bumpy owl' as well as crinkly leaves. We added cinnamon and nut meg smells to our sensory play and enjoyed looking at a range of 'That's not my....' books. The children's favourite book was That's not my fox! We also enjoyed decorating pumpkin biscuits, creating apple prints dipped in paint, and using our handprints to make some bonfire pictures. We are looking forward to our next learning

topic which is Winter celebrations. We will read 'That is not my snowman and that is not my penguin' and plan lots of fun and magical sensory experiences based on the babies interests.

#### Pre-school

Our current learning theme is 'on the move'. So far we have been learning about how different things move. We have looked at how we move around and at how vehicles travel; our favourite

has been 'fire engines and aeroplanes'. We have been enjoying the Autumn weather too. Outside is so much fun in the wind, the children noticed how the wind moves and how the wind blows the leaves; the children were encouraged to catch falling leaves and some

were easier to catch than others. Have you seen our mud kitchen? We have sparked the children's imagination by providing creative recipes and a selection of autumnal materials to inspire mud kitchen creations. The children have enjoyed making autumn leaf soup, conker cakes , pine cone pies,

leaf sandwiches and mud buns! After our Halloween celebrations we created some bonfire art and discussed the colours seen in the night sky which nicely leads us on to our Christmas preparations of how

#### Toddlers

Jess and her staff team have been very busy learning about 'Marvellous Me'. Our Toddler's have been encouraged to get to know themselves and their friends through lots of hands on activities and 'real objects and resources'.

Our theme has also helped the children to learn about Families and we used our doll's house to explore what is inside our homes and what we do at certain times of the day. As well as learning about ourselves we have been exploring Autumn and learning about the changing environment around us through outdoor play, messy play, song and rhymes and stories. We recently went on a nature trail around our lovely nursery grounds and counted 12 squirrels scurrying past!

Play scheme was well attended in October half term all the children enjoyed science experiment week taking part in their own experiments.

The children enjoyed making their own slime ,experimenting with Mentos and coca cola and watching the reaction when both these components are mixed together.

The end of half term was followed by a spooky Halloween party with lots of creative spooky Halloween crafts for all the children to take home.

With Christmas just around the corner we have lots planned for our Christmas and new year play scheme.

In the lead up to the big day we have lots of crafts and fun activities from making an edible snowman to making Decorations for your own tree at home.

#### Things To Do Together At Home


As we're heading into the winter months there are lots of fun and easy activities that can be done at home. Here are some ideas that we know the children would enjoy doing with you:

- Make pretend snow Instant snow powder (from Poundland) & add some water,
- Edible Marshmallow Snowmen Poke cocktail sticks through 2 large marshmallows & use icing pens to

- **Egg Carton Reindeers** Cut up an empty egg carton and paint brown, make and cut/ glue reindeer antlers, and add a red nose & some eyes.

#### <u>Alí's Nursery Winter War</u>mer

Ingredients:

60g pudding rice

600 ml full fat milk

2 tbsp caster sugar

Fruit Coulis to serve- optional

#### Method

- 1. Pre heat your oven to Gas mark 2
- 2. Wash the rice and drain in a sieve. Put into a wide oven proof dish, at least 1 litre capacity. Pour in the milk, add the caster sugar and stir together.
- 3. Place in the oven and bake for 2—2 1/2 hours, or until the pudding has a golden brown skin and the rice is tender and creamy (the longer you leave it, the more thick and sticky it will become)
- 4. Serve warm, add some fruit coulis on top, if you wish. Enjoy!
