Trousers/ leggings, socks/ tights and underwear if potty training.




<u>under 2's</u>

Things To Do Together At Home

As we're heading into the winter months there are lots of fun and easy activities that can be done at home. Here are some ideas that we know the children would enjoy doing with you:

<u>Alí's Nursery Winter Warmer</u> Ingredients:

• 3 tbsp olive oil

- 1 ¼ kg beef mince
- 1 tbsp tomato puree
- 850ml beef stock
- Gravy to thicken
- Broccoli and cauliflower

Method:

- 1. Heat 1 tbsp olive oil in large saucepan and fry 1 ¼ kg beef mince until browned you may need to do this in batches. Set aside as it browns.
- 2. Put the other 2 tbsp olive oil into the pan, add 3 chopped carrots and cook on gentle heat until soft.

1.8kg potatoes chopped

225ml milk

25g butter

- 3. Add 2 finely chopped garlic cloves, 1 tbsp tomato puree, increase the heat and cook for a few mins, then return the beef to the pan.
- 4. Reduce slightly and add the 850ml beef stock, 4 tbsp Worcestershire sauce and gravy.

For the Mash

5. Bring to a simmer and cook uncovered for 45 mins. By this time the gravy should be thick and coating the meat. Check after about 30
