The children have enjoyed getting involved planting seeds and helping to water them, watching them grow into beautiful flowers making the garden look colourful and inviting for the wildlife.



As the children really enjoy this here is the recipe for you to try at home.

Ingredients

350g self–raising flour, 350g Natural yoghurt, 1tsp salt, sprinkle of mixed herbs, 1 jar of pizza sauce, Mozzarella cheese, cheddar cheese.

Method

Heat the oven to 180C

Mix the flour salt and yoghurt together in a bowl until the mixture forms a dough.



Roll out thinly on a floured surface.



Spread the pizza sauce onto the dough and top with the mozzarella and cheddar cheese.

Sprinkle on some mixed herbs and place on a baking tray.

Bake for approximately 15-20 minutes or until golden brown.
